Entry Requirements to SINGAPORE

You **MUST** present yourself for IMMIGRATION clearance at your point of entry into Singapore.

You **MUST** satisfy the following basic requirements before you can be considered for entry:

- **All passports must have at least 6 months validity from the returning date of the cruise.**
- **Sufficient funds for the length of your intended stay**
- **A submitted [SG Arrival Card](#) (Refer to appendix 1)**
- **A valid Singapore entry visa (to check whether you need a visa, refer to [Visa Requirement](#) in Appendix 2)**
- **A confirmed onward or return ticket (where applicable)**
- **Evidence that you can enter your next destination (for example, a visa)**
- **A [Yellow Fever Vaccination Certificate](#), if applicable**
- **Travellers are required to adhere to the latest travel requirements and advisories on the [SafeTravel](#) website where applicable.**
- **A valid REP (Re-Entry Permit) for Singapore Permanent Resident**

VISA REQUIREMENTS

If your travel document is issued by one of the countries/ places listed below, you will require a valid visa to enter Singapore. (For further requirement on individual countries please refer to appendix 2)

YELLOW FEVER VACCINATION CERTIFICATE

The International Certificate of Vaccination for yellow fever is only considered valid 10 days after vaccination and the validity lasts for the life of the person vaccinated.

APPENDIX 3

Accepted COVID-19 Vaccinations for Entry to Singapore

In line with the Singapore's Multi-Ministry Taskforce's announcement on 7 October 2022, VDS will no longer be required for cruise ships calling in Singapore with immediate effect. All passengers and crew, regardless of their vaccination status, may board cruise ships calling in Singapore.

For unvaccinated guests aged 13 and above (i.e. born in 2009 or earlier) and board the ship in a foreign port and arrives in Singapore for disembarkation including shore excursion; these group of guests will need to do a pre-departure test and have the COVID-19 travel insurance. Refer to attached for details.

Requirements for Unvaccinated Passengers Entering Singapore

To determine whether a passenger is vaccinated, please refer to the ICA website at <https://www.ica.gov.sg/enter-transit-depart/entering-singapore> on the list of vaccinations recognised for entry into Singapore.

a	Pre-Departure Test (PDT)	<p>Within two days before arrival into Singapore, take any of the following COVID-19 tests:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Antigen Rapid Test (ART) administered by a trained professional (e.g. ship medical team), or self-administered ART that is remotely supervised by an approved ART provider in Singapore; OR • COVID-19 Polymerase Chain Reaction test. <p>The Pre-Departure Test (PDT) report, which shows a negative test result, must be in English (or accompanied by a notarised English Translation), and clearly states the traveller's name, date of test, as well as the traveller's date of birth or passport number per the passport used to travel to Singapore.</p> <p>A PDT is not required only if you are (a) aged 12 and below (i.e. born in or after 2010) or (b) tested positive for COVID-19 between 14 to 90 days before your date of departure for Singapore. You can use this tool (https://go.gov.sg/recovered-traveller-checker) to check if the pre-departure test can be waived, and the documentation required to prove your first infection or recovery.</p>
b	COVID-19 Travel Insurance	<p>Short-term visitors who are not (a) Singapore Citizens, (b) Permanent Residents or (c) Long Term Pass Holders, must ensure they have travel insurance covering COVID-19, with at least \$30,000 of medical coverage.</p> <p>You may refer to the COVID-19 insurance and medical treatment page (https://www.ica.gov.sg/enter-transit-depart/entering-singapore/COVID-insurance).</p>

APPENDIX 4

Visa Free Travel Facility

The information on this page is a guide for visitors who MAY qualify for the 96-hour visa free transit facility (VFTF). This may be available to nationals of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS), Georgia, India, the People's Republic of China (PRC), Turkmenistan and Ukraine.

Transit travellers who satisfy the criteria for VFTF will have to meet the prevailing entry requirements before they are allowed entry into Singapore. Assessment for entry is determined by the Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA) officers at the point of entry.

Extension of stay for transit travellers under VFTF is strictly not allowed.

Nationals of India and the PRC

If you are in transit to or FROM any third country via Singapore, you MAY be eligible for the 96-hour VFTF if you meet these requirements:

- a) You MAY enter Singapore by any mode of transport but depart only via air or sea. You MUST have a valid onward air/ferry/cruise ticket departing Singapore within 96 hours; and
- b) You MUST have a valid visa*/long-term pass (with a validity of at least 1 month from the date of entry into Singapore under the VFTF) issued by any of the following countries:
 - Australia
 - Canada
 - Germany[^]
 - Japan
 - New Zealand
 - Switzerland[^]
 - United Kingdom
 - United States of America

* A visa is considered valid so long as it is good for entry into one of the eight countries listed above. Travellers with Single Journey Visas (SJV) may still be granted VFTF on the return leg of their journey (i.e. after the SJV is used and no longer valid), but you MUST:

- Travel directly from the country that issued the SJV, en route through Singapore, back to your home country
- Not have returned to your home country since you last used the SJV.

[^] Applies to visas issued by Germany or Switzerland, or Schengen visas that are good for entry to Germany or Switzerland.

Nationals of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS), Georgia, Turkmenistan and Ukraine

If you are in transit to or FROM any third country, you MAY be eligible for the 96-hour VFTF if you have a valid onward air ticket departing within 96 hours. You may enter Singapore by any mode of transport but must depart Singapore by air.
